An era, and a pilgrimage, come to an end

Frank Woodruff Buckles embarked on a pilgrimage of his own on the first day of August in 1917. Like that of his ancestor, William White, it took him on a long, long journey to foreign shores fraught with dangers he might never have anticipated when he was a young boy in Bethany MO.

Frank Buckles was the last surviving American veteran of World War I. He passed away February 27, less than a month after his 110th birthday. He was a 63-year member of the Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants, having been accepted into the Society on 24 Feb 1948.

When President Woodrow Wilson issued a call for volunteers as the United States prepared to enter the War to End All Wars, Frank Buckles was among the first to answer.

In fact, he attempted to answer twice--trying to enlist in the Marine Corps and the Navy, and being turned down both times--before being enlisted in the United States Army, in which he served for three years, including duty in both England and France.

He rose to the rank of Corporal before ending his service in 1920, but did not see combat duty. His primary duties in the Army were as an ambulance driver and as an escort for his commanding officers. He did, however, see the results of combat and, when interviewed in 2008 by the American Legion Magazine, indicated he had not forgotten its horrors. He would not, however, discuss them.

He was one of more than four million American men who enlisted in the Armed Forces during World War I, of whom two million were shipped to France to fight against the Germans.

In 2007, the Department of Veterans' Affairs conducted a search for remaining soldiers from World War I and declared Frank Buckles the sole survivor.

But World War I was not the only adventure for this remarkable man.



After the First World War, he took a job with the White Star Steamship Line--the same line, ironically, that operated the Carpathia, a ship famous for having rescued the survivors of the Titanic, and the ship that took Frank Buckles and his unit to France in late 1917.

In 1940, by then working for the American President Steamship Lines, he was sent to Manilla, The Phillipines, where he was still stationed in December, 1941 when the Japanese invaded. He and about 2000 other civilians were captured and sent to Japanese camps.

Frank W. Buckles remained a prisoner of the Japanese for nearly three-and-a-half years, until the camp in Los Banos, Luzon, was liberated by the 11th Airborne's famous raid on 23 Feb 1945.

After his return to the United States, he married Audrey Mayo in 1946 and they moved to Gap View Farm in Charles Town, West Virginia, where he lived until his passing in February.

His daughter, Susannah Flanagan, lived with him there. Her mother, Virginia, passed away in 1999. Susannah is also a member of the Mayflower Society.

The land on which they lived had been occupied by

13 moons on a turtle's back

For our Junior Members

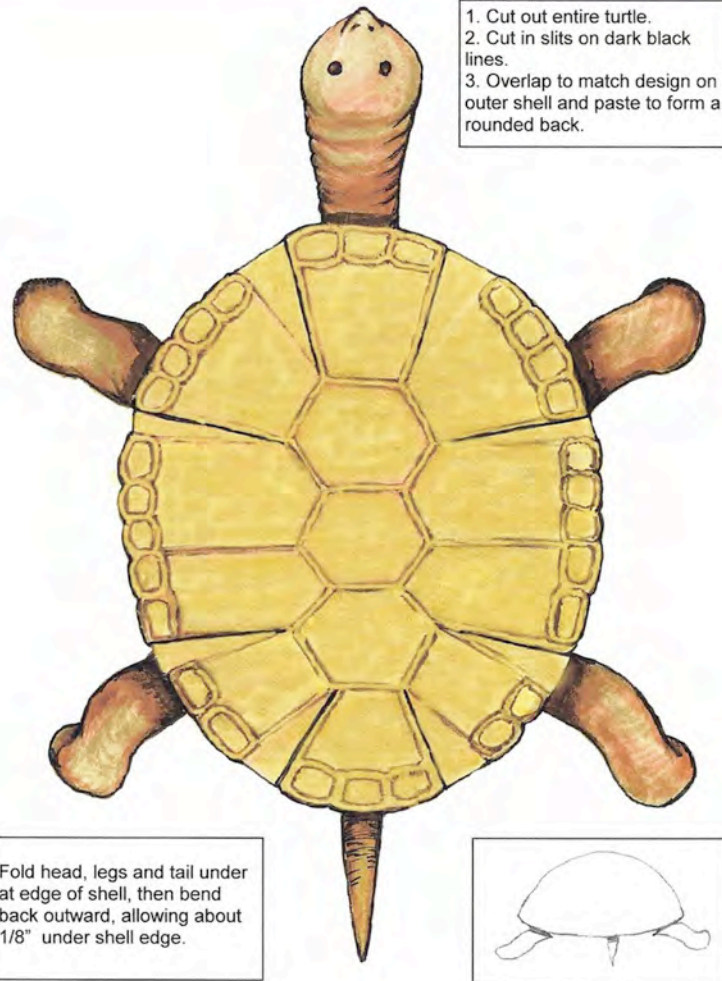
Cut and Paste Turtle

Many American Indians share the knowledge of the 13 moons on a turtle's back. As children they are taught to examine the segments on the back of every turtle. There are 13 large segments which represent the thirteen moon cycles which make up the lunar year. By counting the smaller segments around the edge of the shell, they find there are 28, representing the number of days between new moons.

Every tribe has names for the 13 moons and there are stories that go with each. The names and stories vary from group to group, but each is descriptive of the season in which the new moon appears.

To make your own turtle, print out the drawing at the right on heavy paper or card stock. By following the directions, you will have your own pet turtle showing the number of moons and the number of days between them.

To make a bigger turtle, simply scan the drawing and enlarge it in your computer.



1. Cut out entire turtle.
2. Cut in slits on dark black lines.
3. Overlap to match design on outer shell and paste to form a rounded back.

Fold head, legs and tail under at edge of shell, then bend back outward, allowing about 1/8" under shell edge.

116th Annual Meeting program features Peggy Baker

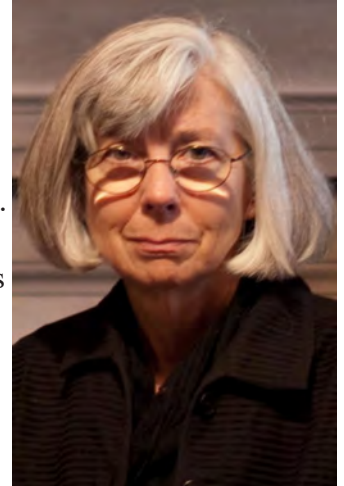
This year's Annual Meeting will take place Saturday April 16 at the Holiday Inn in Mansfield.

his ancestors when the area was first settled.

Frank Buckles received many honors in life and has also been granted the honor of being buried in Arlington National Cemetery.

Only a few years ago, in 1999, the then-president of France, Jacques Chirac, awarded him the Legion of Honor. In March 2008, then-President George W. Bush honored him during a ceremony at the White House in Washington, D.C. He also received the Victory Medal, the 75th Anniversary Medal, and the Occupation Medal.

Frank Buckles did not let his advancing years slow him down. He continued to work his cattle farm after turning 100 and said in one interview in 2008 that the only time he felt his age was "when I try to walk."
